The African Union was created in 2002, replacing the Organization of African Unity. The main roles and responsibilities of the African Union are to rid the continent of the remnants of colonization and apartheid; to coordinate cooperation for Africa's development; to promote solidarity among African States; to safeguard territorial integrity of Member States; and to promote international cooperation within the framework of the United Nations.
