## ASEAN (Association of Southeast Asian Nations)

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), an organisation comprised of 10 countries, was formed to encourage regional cooperation between member states and to encourage economic growth. It was established in 1967 by five nations: the Philippines, Malaysia, Thailand, Indonesia and Singapore. ASEAN also promotes non-interference in the sovereignty of other nations as a central principle in its Charter. This has led to regional stability but also the criticism of propping up authoritarian regimes. Since the establishment of ASEAN, the ASEAN Regional Forum (ARF), the ASEAN Security Community (ASC), and the ASEAN Free Trade Area (AFTA) have all been formed, among others, within the ASEAN community to support these aims.
