The Caucasus

The Caucasus regions of Europe and Asia (Russian Kavkaz) have historically been turbulent and volatile, and in more recent times the unrest has projected this area into the media spotlight. There are many ethnic groups within these areas, and across the entire region more than 40 languages and dialects are spoken. The two most prominent areas within the Caucasus are Transcaucasia and North Caucasia; the Circassians, Dagestani, Kabards and Ossetians are the major ethnic groups in North Caucasia; the Armenians, Azeris, and Georgians are the largest ethnic groups in Transcaucasia.
