## Counter-Terrorism

Counter-terrorism is a term used to describe the techniques and strategies used by governments or military organisations to fight or prevent acts of terrorism. Ways to counter terrorism are varied, but can include the following: use of military force against those committing acts of terror; not protecting terrorists in any country where they may continue to carry out their activities; preventing terrorists from accessing funding; preventing terrorists from creating networks; information-gathering and improving policing both internationally and domestically.<sup>1</sup>
