## Joint Doctrine

Joint doctrine guides the actions of forces, composed of two or more services, in coordinated action towards a common goal. It gives guidance on how to conduct and undertake joint or combined operations, usually comprising of land, naval and air forces. Joint operations and joint based warfare carried out between services is designed to achieve a common goal more effectively; the success of joint operations depends on all services accepting a clearly understood doctrine.
